In Internal-Semester Assessment :

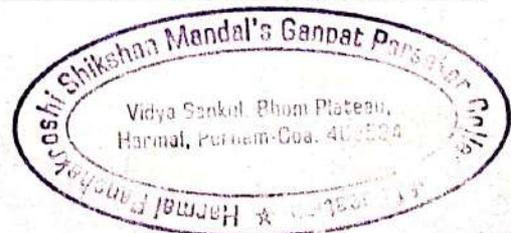
- Questions in assessments are mapped to specific CO's through a manuscript.

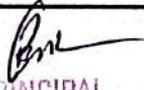

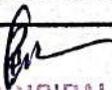

- OBE manual and Evaluation reforms has been prepared by TLET cell of our college for the benefit of staff.


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- 12 MOOC's with four quadrants were developed and uploaded on open-Edx platform in collaboration with Ramanujan College. 70% of the college students enrolled for the MOOCs and completed the course.
- Regular use of smart boards, projectors, and LMS to make classroom teaching interactive.
- Training sessions for teachers and students on digital tools, e-content creation, and open educational resources and research tools.
- Awareness sessions for faculty on framing and mapping Course Outcomes (COs) and Programme Outcomes (POs).
- ISA question papers and rubrics designed and mapped to COs for better measurement of learning.
- Regular analysis of attainment data to plan remedial measures. Development and sharing of e-content, recorded lectures, and reference materials on LMS.
- Encouraging use of MOOCs and other online platforms for self-learning.
